Eval Comments: “The behaviors described today reflect the dog’s responses in an Animal Care Center environment and during assessment. A dog's behavior in an Animal Care Center may differ significantly from how they behave in a home. Stress, confinement, and unfamiliar surroundings can cause dogs to act out or suppress behaviors that may emerge later. A dog's behavior may change based on surroundings, training, medical, socialization, and life experiences.”

Quincy greeted the runner with a relaxed body, soft eyes, an open pant, and a loose tail wag. He was easy to leash and remove from the kennel, pulled strongly on leash, and was easy to collar. In the catch pen, his body was neutral, and his tail was neutral with a loose wag. He entered the yard, and greeted the other dogs with a slightly tense body and raised hackles. He immediately began mounting one of the dogs, but was easy to steer. After a few corrections from the handlers, he began to engage in appropriate play with the other dogs. He solicited petting from the handlers. Quincy is tolerant of the other dogs, has a medium energy level, and prefers a push/pull playstyle.
